


Extended Operation / Extreme Conditions

A CAUTION

Prolonged exposure to cold and/or vibration may result in injury. Read and follow all safety and operation instructions to minimize risk of injury. Failure to follow instructions may result in painful wrist/hand/arm injuries.

It is believed that a condition called Raynaud's Phenomenon, which affects the fingers of certain individuals, may be brought about by exposure to vibration and cold. Exposure to vibration and cold may cause tingling and burning sensations, followed by loss of color and numbness in the fingers. The following precautions are strongly recommended, because the minimum exposure, which might trigger the ailment, is unknown.


- Keep your body warm, especially the head, neck, feet, ankles, hands, and wrists.
- Maintain good blood circulation by performing vigorous arm exercises during frequent work breaks, and also by not smoking.
- Limit the hours of operation. Try to fill each day with jobs where operating the unit or other handheld power equipment is not required.



 If you experience discomfort, redness, and swelling of the fingers followed by whitening and loss of feeling, consult your physician before further exposing yourself to cold and vibration.

Repetitive Stress Injuries (RSI)

It is believed that overusing the muscles and tendons of the fingers, hands, arms, and shoulders may cause soreness, swelling, numbness, weakness, and extreme pain in those areas. Certain repetitive hand activities may put you at a high risk for developing a Repetitive Stress Injury (RSI). An extreme RSI condition is Carpal Tunnel Syndrome (CTS), which could occur when your wrist swells and squeezes a vital nerve that runs through the area. Some believe that



prolonged exposure to vibration may contribute to CTS. CTS can cause severe pain for months or even years.

To reduce the risk of RSI/CTS, do the following:

- Avoid using your wrist in a bent, extended, or twisted position. Instead try
 to maintain a straight wrist position. Also, when grasping, use your whole
 hand, not just the thumb and index finger.
- Take periodic breaks to minimize repetition and rest your hands.
- Reduce the speed and force with which you do the repetitive movement.
- Do exercises to strengthen the hand and arm muscles.



Immediately stop using all power equipment and consult a doctor if you
feel tingling, numbness, or pain in the fingers, hands, wrists, or arms. The
sooner RSI/CTS is diagnosed, the more likely permanent nerve and
muscle damage can be prevented.



- FLEXIBLE DRIVE CABLE Cable end fits into upper drive shaft coupler. Lubricate drive cable every 25 hours with POWER BLENDXTM grease.
- DEBRIS SHIELD ASSEMBLY Included in plastic bag (co-pack).
 MUST be installed on unit before use, see Assembly Instructions.
 Mounts on the Gear Housing Assembly just above the cutting
 attachment. Helps protect the operator by deflecting debris produced

ASSEMBLY

Power Head Shaft/Lower Shaft Assembly

WARNING

Do not perform maintenance or assembly procedures with engine running.

Parts Required: PAS or SRM-SB Power Head w/Shaft & Coupling

- 1. Set Power Head/Shaft Assembly on a level surface.
- 2. Pull locater pin (A) out, and turn counter-clockwise 1/4 turn to lock-out position.
- 3. Remove vinyl cap from attachment drive shaft.
- 4. Remove cardboard spacer, if necessary.

Note: Your coupler may appear different than coupler shown.



 Carefully fit attachment drive shaft assembly into coupler (B) to decal assembly line (C), making sure that the inner lower drive shaft engages the square upper drive shaft socket.


Note: Earlier model Power Heads may have shorter couplings.


Note: Lower bearing housing

and head assembly must be in line with the engine.

 Rotate locater pin (A) ¼ turn clockwise to engage lower shaft hole. Insure locater pin is fully engaged by twisting lower drive shaft. Locater pin should snap flush in coupler. Full engagement will prevent further shaft rotation.

 Secure lower shaft assembly to coupler by tightening clamping knob (D).





Debris Shield Installation


Parts Required: Debris Shield Assembly.

A CAUTION

Wear Gloves or personal injury may result:


- Cutoff knife is sharp.
- Gearcase and surrounding area may be hot.

- Remove wing nut (A), washer
 (B), and bolt (C).
- 2. Snap the shield over the bearing housing.
- 3. Install bolt (C), washer (B), and wing nut (A).



Nylon Line Head Installation/Removal

- Remove plastic threaded shaft sleeve from threaded PTO shaft.
- Align locating hole in upper plate with hole in bearing housing and insert locking tool (A).
- Place large washer (B) then line head (C) on threaded shaft, followed by small metal washer (D) and lock nut (E).
- Install locknut. Turn lock nut clockwise, and tighten securely.



NOTICE

Remember to remove the locking tool.

5. To remove line head, reverse assembly instructions.

OPERATION

WARNING

Never wear line shorter than 38 mm (1.5 in.) extension from head, otherwise over-speeding and engine damage may result.

Lubrication

Parts Required: Lithium Base Grease

- Remove plastic shield.
- 2. Loosen bearing housing locating screw (A), at the top of the housing, loosen mounting screw (B) and remove gear case from drive housing.
- Pull the flexible drive shaft (C) 3. from the drive housing, wipe clean and re-coat with a thin coating 15 ml (0.5 oz.) of grease.
- Slide the flexible drive shaft back in the drive housing being careful not to get dirt on the flexible drive shaft.
- Install the bearing housing and shield. 5.



Nylon Line Replacement


Level 1.

¹Apply lithium based grease.

Parts Required: Pre-cut Nylon Line

- 1. Shut engine OFF. Lay unit on the ground with head assembly up.
- 2. Remove old nylon line through center recess of head.
- Thread new lines through outside holes (A) in housing until ends meet in center of recess.

Note: Insert cutting line ends to center of head recess to insure easy removal of used lines.





STORAGE

Storage Hook Installation

- Insert small end of hook into locating hole on attachment shaft.
- Slide plastic cap onto end of attachment shaft.
